

JUSTICE WHITE PORTRAIT UNVEILED BY WIDOW

Ceremony Conducted by K. of
C. Council Named in His
Honor in Clarendon.

SENATORS LAUD CAREER

An oil portrait of the late Chief Justice Edward Douglas White, of the United States, was unveiled by his widow last night in St. Charles' school, Clarendon, Va., in connection with the celebration of the first anniversary of the Edward Douglas White council, Knights of Columbus. More than 600 persons were present.

Eulogies of Justice White were delivered by United States Senators Joseph E. Ransdall and David I. Walsh, and by Representative George H. O'Connor, of Louisiana.

Other speakers were E. Wade Ball, treasurer of Arlington county, and Dr. Charles I. Griffith, District of Columbia state deputy of the Knights of Columbus. The guests included William DeVaughn, Virginia district deputy of the Knights of Columbus. Joseph Dugan, lecturer of the local council, presided.

Mrs. White, who presented the portrait to the council, was escorted to the rostrum by Mrs. J. O. Frank, regent of the Daughters of Isabella, the members of which organization tendered a banquet to the guests following the ceremonies. The musical program was given by the glee club of Catholic university and John Paul Jones, George H. O'Connor, and Bernard Fitzgerald, all of Washington.
